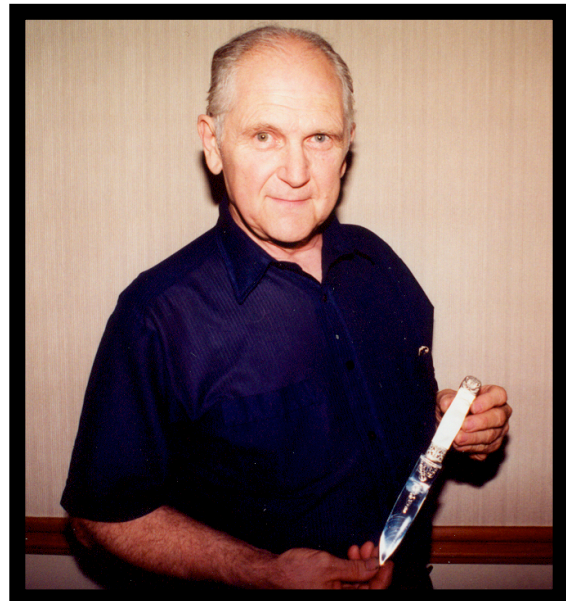

SAD NEWS

Fred Henderson, a long time member of Flint River Knife Club, passed away Tuesday, December 21, 2004. He was an artist whose work is coveted by the rich and famous. His woodcarvings and metal engravings, which he created in his spare time using a hammer and chisel, earned



him prominent friends "but not a lot of money," said Laura Henderson, his wife of 49 years. "He always said we had a roof over our heads and that's all we needed."

Fred chiseled naval scenes on a miniature cannon and presented it to Gov. Jimmy Carter in 1974. A hunting rifle that Fred engraved with images of Abraham Lincoln, the Liberty Bell and other historical events -- to commemorate the nation's bicentennial in 1976 -- is displayed in Gerald Ford's presidential library in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

He became friends with Hank Aaron after presenting the Atlanta Braves star an engraved shotgun to commemorate the slugger's 715th home run. Fred also carved a jewelry box for singer Amy Grant.

"He was just a super fellow. He was a master engraver...and he was known the world over," said lifelong friend, James Steinbrecher of Huntington, W.Va. A native of Huntington, Fred enjoyed the fame but was most proud of being named to his Huntington East High School's Hall of Fame.

"I've stood in the White House and the Oval Office but being recognized by the town, school you grew up in is No.1," he said in a 1987 interview with The Atlanta Journal-Constitution.

During W.W.II, Fred served as an instructor at West Point Military Academy. He later worked as a firefighter in Alaska.

A talented athlete, Fred was an all-star baseball catcher in high school and tried out with the Cleveland Indians and the Cincinnati Reds. The Reds offered him a contract, but he stayed in Huntington to be with his mother who was ill with cancer. He eventually went to work at glassmaker Owens-Illinois and transferred to Atlanta in 1957. *(Excerpts taken from the Atlanta Journal-Constitution)*

This knife club could always rely on Fred to help in whatever way he could. He frequently engraved knives at no charge for the benefit drawing for the club. He would also help out at the annual knife shows. Last year he and John Anderson won the first "Recognition of Service Award" for their faithful and outstanding service to this knife club. Fred said that he

was "quite honored" to have received this award, but it is all of us who knew Fred that feel honored; to have known such a kind and caring man. We will miss him greatly.
