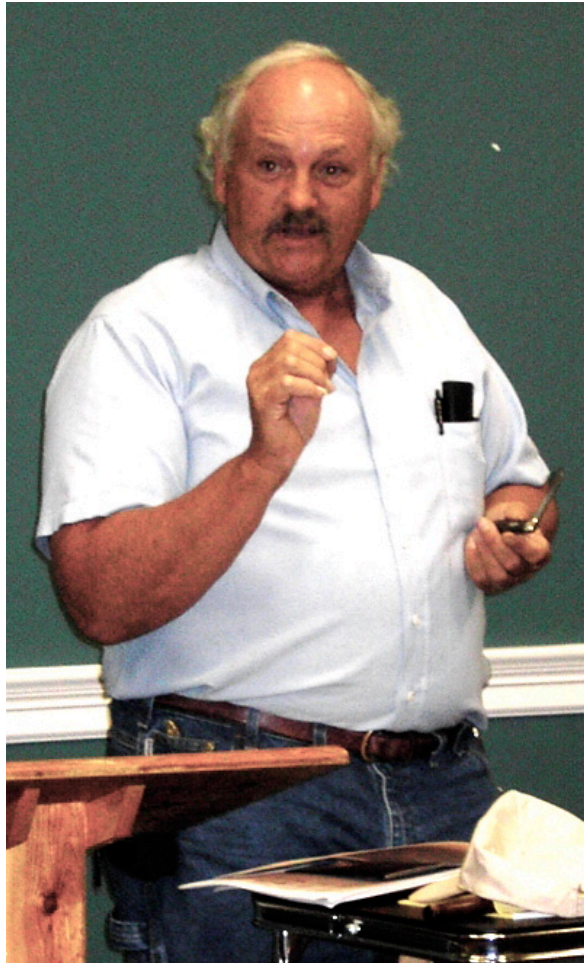
Flint River Knife Club
